The new cross is much larger and is now fabricated steel with a wood facing (thank you to a generous parishioner who paid for the new cross). You will also notice that the white fiberglass corpus is missing from the Cross. During the winter months parishioner Matt Whyne will be adding color to make the corpus life-like. Matt is a talented artist and we are excited about how beautiful this will look gracing the area outside of the Church.
