Guide for what constitutes a Liturgy

Holy days of obligation (below) are NOT counted as liturgies

- Every Sunday (or Saturday evening vigil)
- January 1 – The solemnity of Mary, Mother of God
- Thursday of the 6th week of Easter – The solemnity of the ascension
- August 15th – The solemnity of the assumption of the Blessed virgin Mary
- November 1st – All Saints day
- December 8th – The solemnity of the immaculate conception
- December 25th – The solemnity of the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ

Potential liturgies: (so long as the item listed below is NOT held on a day of obligation above)

Look for the following in the bulletin, you can have any parishioner in attendance sign your liturgy sheet, to verify your attendance.

- Daily morning mass in chapel (Mon – Saturday [not Sat evening vigil])
- Catholic Funeral mass
- Catholic Marriage
- Catholic Baptism
- Stations of the Cross (held Fridays during lent)
- Ash Wednesday (First day of Lent)
- Holy Thursday (Thursday before Easter)
- Good Friday (Friday before Easter)
- Holy Saturday (Saturday before Easter.. but not Easter Vigil mass)
- Forty Hours Solemn Eucharistic Devotion
- Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
- Stations of the Nativity
- Evening Prayer and Benedictions
